"Cleared for Publication"

This past year, news broadcasts in Israel frequently began with the words: "Cleared for publication." This is a term used by the Israeli media to announce that the names of Israeli soldiers who have fallen in battle can now be made public, (it happens only after their families and close relatives have been personally informed). It's a combination of words that haunts every Israeli family. A daily reminder of the price we pay for a war we did not choose.

Based on these words, poet Dael Rodriguez Garcia wrote the following:

Cleared For Publication
That our hearts are broken
And in hidden places in empty rooms
Thousands of sobs are choking silently.

Cleared for Publication
That open season was declared on us
We were plundered in the dark
Of the most precious of precious.

Its already Cleared for Publication
That the magical shining light
Of our beloved face is extinguished
However, beneath the same soil,
A stubborn plant is sprouting
Sending roots without end
Tightly grasped with love.

Amid the storm that seems to be in our lives this past year, we are facing both the collapse of so many things we thought to be true and the uncertainty of the future. Having experienced both tremendous weakness and strength, a sense of isolation as well as a tight community – in this hurricane of feelings I am trying to stop and make sense of what I have learned this past year. What is cleared – at least for me – for publication.

It became clear to me that we are much more vulnerable than I ever thought we were. That the idea that our intelligence forces will never fail us again as they did on Yom Kippur of 1976 – was a false idea. And that the idea that a monstrous defensive system, made of walls and cameras and automated machine guns, can be easily taken over by people with shovels and a tractor. That the sacred covenant between a people and its army died slowly and painfully, in the long hours where the only question asked was: "Where are they?"

But it also became clear that we are so much stronger than I could have ever imagined. That the resilience of Israelis has no limit, that in minutes every person capable will ask him and herself:" What can I do?" and tens of thousands of people will leave everything behind and say "Hineini"- I am here. Thousands just showed up at their reserve duty units (even if they were discharged from it years ago for being "too old" to fight), others rushed to find the first available flight from

India, or Brazil- cutting the "big trip after the army" short – to not leave their friends alone on the battlefield. Tens of thousands said "Hineini" by offering their expertise as social workers, teachers, or cooks to help restore some normality to the lives of those who lost everything on that horrible day. Donations of every possible item, from military gear to dolls kept pouring in for months to come.

It became clear to me that the enemy we face can't be described just as cruel and inhumane. I learned a new lesson about evil, about hate, about the deepest and darkest places people can reach. Murdering entire families, raping, looting, taking 80-year-old holocaust survivors as hostages. And I also learned a lesson about myself, and how anger and rage can change me. How I too, driven by those justified emotions, am capable of hating "all of them" and how I too can close my heart to the pain of a mother in Gaza having to bury her twin babies for which she has been trying to give birth for years. How easy is to see the other side as a whole – as the enemy, without making any distinction between those seeking peace and those who have no interest in it. I learned that I can easily ignore the Torah calling me to not seek revenge, as easy as I can argue the existence of "non innocents" in Gaza.

It became clear to me that the connection between American Jews and Israelis is stronger than I thought it was. That when called to action, we too said "Hineini" and opened our hearts and pockets to support every possible need, we traveled to Israel not to enjoy the beaches and the beauty of Jerusalem, but to pick apples, and to lighten the days of survivors and soldiers. It became clear to me how much the Jewish community matters here in the U.S., and how much we need each other, despite our differences, because so many whom we considered friends showed their true nature. And it became clear to me that the hard work of building bridges with other faith leaders, while being tenacious, is worthwhile because their support at times like this is priceless.

It became clear to me that family is bigger than just the blood connection, because when asked how my children in Israel are, I felt as if every one of the young people, my kids' age, kidnapped from a dance party, held underground in Gaza, is my child, and they are not, not at all, doing well.

It became clear to me how extreme situations make us see leaders in their true colors, who are those who rise to the occasion, putting their own interests and needs aside, and doing all they can to offer both political, physical, and emotional support. And who are those who are incapable of taking responsibility, who point fingers at others hoping to lay all blame on everyone but themselves?

It became clear to me that Israelis are determined to never allow such a thing to happen again, and that the path to assuring this is the total destruction of Hamas's ability to govern in Gaza. At the same time, it is clearer than ever that the drums of a much bigger war in the north are getting louder and louder and that this is truly not just a local war with neighboring enemies but that until we cut Iran's ability to fuel this dispute – it will go on and on and on. And it became clear that by we – I am talking not just about Israel, this effort must be one that involves the entire free world.

And it became clear to me that even in the darkest moments in our lives, we have the amazing capacity to hold on to hope, to imagine and envision better days and times.

Gali Ravitz, a poet, therapist, and holistic trainer wrote this poem in January of this year.

May it serve us all as a guideline as we enter this new year

This is a period

In which, it is hard to speak

Of horizon,

It seems that there is not anything "on the horizon"

And yet.

When I close my eyes

At night,

Before sleep

I remember the places I wanted to be in

My children, my loves

And I become weightless

Like a seagull

Soaring very high

Drawing me a line

And fly in its direction.
