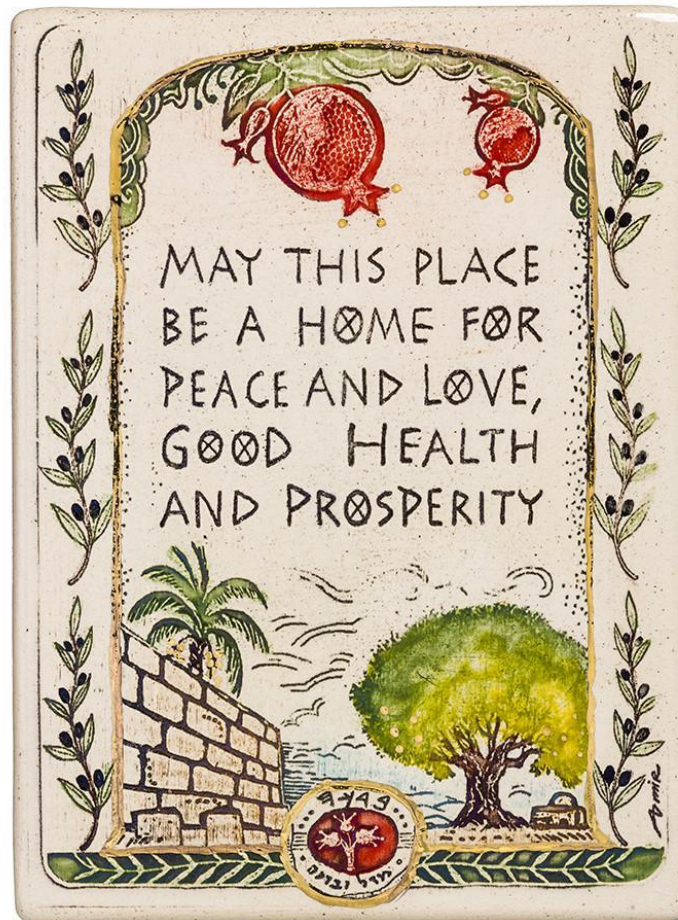

Shalom Temple Judea,

Popular author Emily St. John Mandel wrote her dystopian novel *Station Eleven* over ten years ago - and it's an eerily prescient take on a post-pandemic world. In *Station Eleven*, a covid-like flu spreads quickly and kills 99% of the world's population. The entire infrastructure of the civilized world changes rapidly and the only thing the few remaining survivors are left to do is just that- survive. But even in this seemingly bleak dystopian "eat or be eaten" world, a traveling symphony orchestra forms to bring entertainment and inspiration to those they meet. On the side of the symphony's horse-driven caravan, the musicians wrote "survival is insufficient."

This fictional traveling symphony understood what became clear to so many of us during the real pandemic- that just surviving, that JUST living by the mercy of our calendar, is insufficient. Even in- especially in- the darkest times, the musicians' motto reminds us we must try every day to bring beauty and light to our lives. The traveling symphony in *Station Eleven* resonated with me as a secular version of the Jewish value called "chiddur mitzvah" which means beautifying a mitzvah (i.e. using a beautiful kiddush cup instead of a plain plastic cup) in order to honor God. So too, should we "chiddur mitzvah" our lives- we should beautify our lives to honor God, our Creator, by doing more than simply "surviving"- because survival is insufficient- we should strive each and every day to live lives of meaning.

I spoke about the importance of spending time each day focusing on your kavanah- your intention and purpose - when I had the honor of sharing a sermon entitled "Start with Your Why in 5785" on Erev Rosh Hashanah. I mentioned that in his world-famous Ted Talk, "Start with Why," self-help guru Simon Sinek teaches that "Our WHY is our purpose, cause or belief — the driving force behind everything we do." Since Rosh Hashanah, I have been speaking with many of you about your "why" or "kavanah" and how you focus on what brings beauty to your lives. I've also had the chance to read another great book, "The Lazy Genius Way: Embrace What Matters, Ditch What Doesn't" by lifestyle expert Kendra Adachi to explore the "how" of living a life of intention even further. She concurs with the ancient Jewish wisdom of starting your day with prayer, gratitude, and reflection as she writes,

"A life of meaning doesn't happen in one fell swoop but in small intentional decisions day after day. They matter and they count. Want to feel like a person? Want to remember the truth of WHO you are? Spend a minute each day taking deep breaths and focus on your why, and what matters to you. If we know our "why" our decisions get a lot easier and Nos get a lot easier and our yeses get more selective."

That is why, Sinek also teaches that truly inspiring leaders and organizations start with a clear sense of why

they do what they do, rather than just focusing on what they do or how they do it.. There is a reason every synagogue has a motto above the ark- it's to focus our thoughts and intentions on what matters. Over the Temple Judea ark we are constantly reminded to "Da Lifnei Mi Atah Omed: know Whom before you stand'- this is our collective "why"- to remember that we are a part of community, that it's not all about us: it's about ALL of us- and it's about the One who brought us.

So, as Thanksgiving approaches this year, I pray that you will continue to find a way to live your life with intention- and thank God we have our Jewish tradition to help guide us in doing just that. In fact, the entire structure of Jewish life is designed to help us live with kavanah- intention- starting with our tradition of daily morning prayer. Thankfully, as progressive Jews, we can make this tradition our own- maybe it's, as suggested in my sermon, saying "baruch atah adonai" before you sip your blessed coffee in the morning. It might be saying "shema" before you get out of bed or taking a deep breath and thanking God for a beautiful day when you leave the house. It might be kissing the mezuzah on your way out to remind you to live your values during your day's journey. Maybe it's simply putting on a song you love while visualizing your why.... I would love to hear your "why" and how you keep focused on your kavanah, your intention, so please shoot me a text (646.660.1817) or email (Rose@gotj.org) to share!

This month, the delicious and gratitude- filled holiday of Thanksgiving gives us another meaningful moment to focus on each of our whys. While we enjoy our turkey, stuffing, and football, I encourage each of us to take a deep breath, look around and find a way to live our why. Is it going out of your way to bond with a moody teenage grandchild even when it's challenging? Is it making a meaningful connection with a new friend in your community? Is it bringing Jewish tradition into your everyday life by blessing the stuffing with "hamotzi" before the meal? No matter your age or stage in life, this practice of intention and gratitude will empower you to live your kavanah every day. As Rabbi Nachman of Breslov teaches, "If you believe that we can profoundly falter, believe that we can profoundly fix." It's never too late to "chiddur mitzvah" your life because we all know, deep in our neshamot, our Jewish souls, that "survival is insufficient."

However, I am really happy to share that as we approach November, the only month without a Jewish holiday, I am ready to take a deep breath, and move forward with renewed energy, positivity, and hope. I would also like to give thanks and express my gratitude to so many of you.

IN THANKS

First, I would like to thank Kaylene Cole. I know many of you attended our High Holy Days – so you will join me in my sentiments– that with only ten days’ notice – Kaylene took our Holy Days to a new level. Her voice uplifted us, her positivity filled our hearts, and her energy enriched everyone’s experience. We feel so blessed to have her as part of our TJ team. She will be accompanying Rabbi Yaron for about half of our Friday night worship and a few other select holidays.

Next, I would like to thank Cantor Shira Ginsburg for agreeing to help us with the balance of this fiscal year. In June we had arranged with Cantor Shira to be our temple’s Cantor Scholar in Residence for one Friday a month. Now, Cantor Shira will be accompanying Rabbi Yaron for the other half of our Friday night worship and many of our student’s Bar/Bat Mitzvah services. Cantor Shira Ginsburg holds the distinguished title of Cantor Emerita of East End Temple where she served as Senior Cantor for 18 years.

Finally, a big thank you to St. Mark’s Church for graciously allowing us to hold our Yom Kippur services at their church and to all of you who helped us move from the Eissey Theatre to St. Mark’s and move from St. Mark’s back to TJ. While I hope something like this never happens again, I must admit that these challenging circumstances helped us truly understand the power of community, the importance of relationships, deepen our appreciation for our temple family and our ability to come together, and appropriately shift our focus. Ending our Yom Kippur worship with a monumental communal effort was inspiring. It has caused me to brainstorm – and envision what we could do next year that would allow us to be together – for our temple’s greater good. And yes, I already have some ideas so be on the lookout! 😊

SEARCH UPDATE

We have submitted our placement documents to both the ACC – American Cantor’s Conference and the CCAR – Central Conference of American Rabbis. Most candidates will begin their processes in early November. Our goal is to find another clergy who will be a worship leader. This could be a rabbi or a cantor. Given that there are not a lot of clergy

in the search process, we are leaving our options open to find the right person, the right fit, vs. the title.

OTHER IMPORTANT TRANSITIONS

Rabbi Rose Durbin has taken over teaching our Torah Study on Saturdays at 9 a.m. via Zoom. Rabbi Rose will lead a meditative service which will include traditional prayers as well as creative opportunities for reflection and personal prayer. Each service will feature different perspectives on our traditional Shabbat liturgy including poetry, music, modern midrash (commentary), and even pop culture. Join our friendly group for an uplifting and joyful start to your Saturday morning before we delve into Torah study.

Michael Ross has agreed to lead minyan on Monday mornings which will be by Zoom. Rabbi Yaron will be leading minyan on Thursdays in person at Temple Judea.

Beth Pennamacoor has joined our team as our Bar/Bat Mitzvah tutor. Beth has over 30 years of experience working as a Cantorial Soloist at various local temples. Beth will be working one on one with our students on their Torah portions as well as all their blessings.

Rabbi Yaron will be working with our Bar/Bat Mitzvah students on their D'Var Torah for the rest of this year. Because these lessons happen in the afternoon and evenings he will no longer be able to teach the God 2.0 class originally scheduled for Wednesday evenings.

We are excited to welcome Ben Holtzworth to our team. Ben is a dual Israeli / American citizen, and he will be teaching our 6th grade students as well as helping teach our adult Hebrew classes.

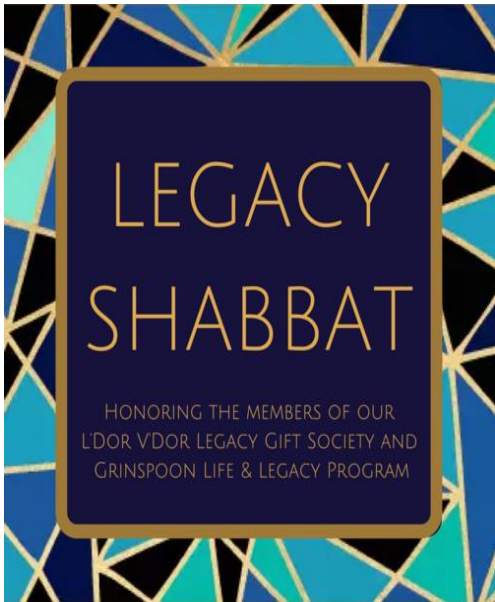

I convinced her to keep the drums. Eventually I rented a room in temple, and I advertised a free concert. For free everybody shows up and my wife too.

Saul has now played around the world and at the Vatican, the White House and in Israel. Don't miss this amazing experience!

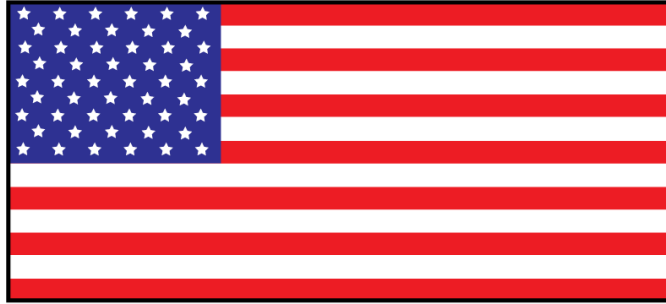

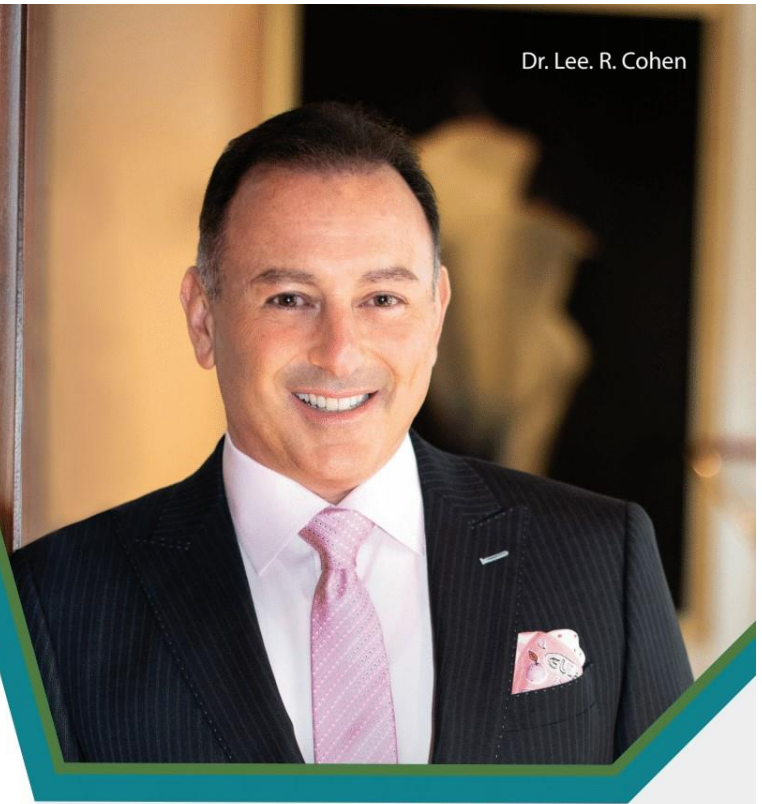
