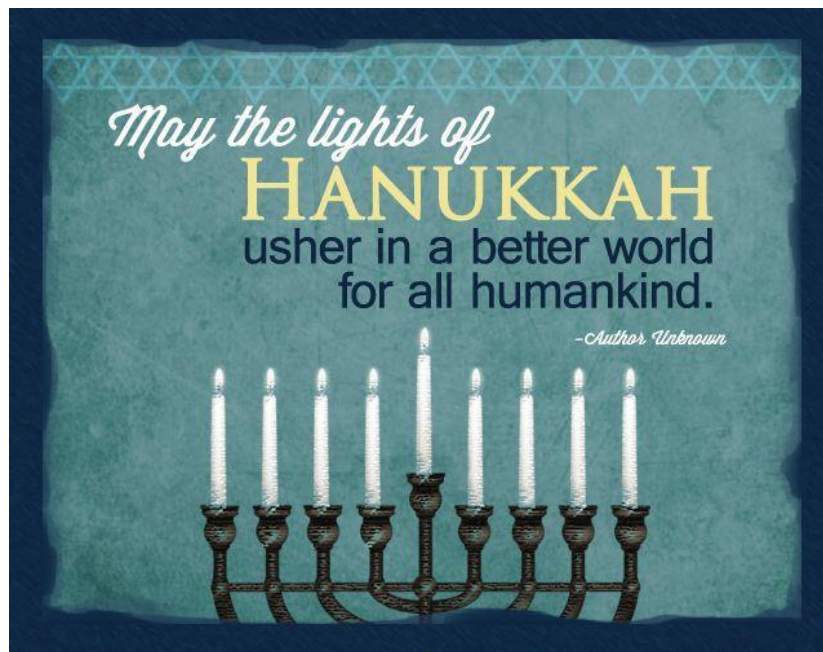

The Maccabees: Torchbearers of Jewish Resilience and Identity

Holidays, like Hanukkah, serve as prisms that transport us through time, enabling us to experience and internalize core values. Hanukkah is more than an eight-day Jewish festival, that commemorates the miracle of a single day's worth of oil lasting for eight days in the ancient Temple. Hanukkah gives us 8 days to reflect on enduring values such as resilience, faith, and the triumph of light over darkness.

While the miracle of the oil lasting eight days is recorded in the Talmud, there is much more to the story to be found in the Book of Maccabees. The book of Maccabees is not officially part of the Jewish biblical canon. Instead, it is included in a collection of ancient works called the Apocrypha, Greek for the 'outside' books, i.e. the books that were non-canonized. It is in the book of Maccabees that we learn about the historical details of the Maccabee family, the persecutions they resisted, and the military victories they celebrated. This annual tradition reinforces the importance of perseverance and religious freedom. By reliving the story of Hanukkah each year, we not only remember the past but also internalize these core values, guiding our actions and strengthening our cultural identity, ensuring they continue to shine brightly in our lives.

So, let's take some time this year to get to know who the Maccabees were!

If only there were a news show like 60 Minutes to help us get to know them better. Here is what the transcript might look like if Judah Maccabee were alive today.

Interviewer: Today, we have the extraordinary privilege of conversing with a figure of monumental historical significance, Judah Maccabee, the leader of the Maccabean Revolt. Judah, your legacy is celebrated annually during Hanukkah, and you are hailed as a paragon of Jewish resilience. To begin, could you tell us about the origins of the Maccabean movement?

Judah Maccabee: Thank you for having me. Our movement began as a necessary response to the imposition of Hellenistic culture and religion upon our people in Judea by Antiochus IV Epiphanes. It was not just about foreign domination; it was a direct attack on our way of life, our religion, and our identity. Hellenism demanded that we abandon our Jewish way of life and adopt Greek culture. The Selucid King Antiochus forbade both circumcision and possession of Jewish scriptures on pain of death. He forbade the observance of the Sabbath and the offering of sacrifices at the Temple. He also required Jewish leaders to sacrifice to idols. While enforcement may be targeting only Jewish leaders, ordinary Jews were also killed as a warning to others. When my father, Mattathias, was asked to perform a sacrifice to a Greek god,

he refused, killing the king's agent and sparking the revolt. We retreated to the hills, and there, we began our fight for our traditions and our law.

Interviewer: Your guerrilla warfare tactics were revolutionary for their time. What was the key to your military success against the mighty Greek Seleucid Empire?

Judah Maccabee: The success of our revolt was rooted in our intimate knowledge of the terrain and our deep commitment to our cause. Our tactics were born of necessity, exploiting the element of surprise and our mobility to offset the Greek Seleucid's numerical and logistical advantages. Our people were fighting for their faith, for their very existence, which provided a morale and determination that could not be matched by any regular army.

Interviewer: Your struggle wasn't merely a military one, it was also spiritual. How did your faith guide you and your followers?

Judah Maccabee: Our faith was the cornerstone of everything we did. The name "Maccabee" is believed by many to be an acronym for the biblical phrase "Mi Kamocha Ba'elim Adonai?," meaning, "God, Who is Like You?" a declaration of the uniqueness of our God. It was this unshakeable belief that God was on our side that gave us the strength to face overwhelming odds. Every victory was a testament to our faith, and with each success, our resolve only grew stronger.

Interviewer: Since you mentioned your faith, the book of Maccabees records that in 167 BCE, the Greeks initially succeeded in defeating Jews by attacking them on Shabbat and slaughtering them because they refused to fight back on their Sabbath.

Judah Maccabee: This outlook was later rejected. My father, Mattathias, the leader of the revolt, declared, "If any man comes against us on the Sabbath day, we shall fight against him and not all die as our brothers did in their hiding places."

Interviewer: What does the Maccabee name and the symbol of your revolt represent for Jews today?

Judah Maccabee: The Maccabee name has become a symbol of Jewish endurance and the defense of our religious freedom. It is a reminder that no matter the darkness, there is always hope, and a small light can dispel great darkness. Our revolt shows that we must always be ready to stand up for our identity and beliefs, even when it seems the whole world is against us.

Interviewer: We see the Maccabee name in many places today, from sports clubs to military units. How do you feel about this legacy?

Judah Maccabee: It is humbling to see that the name of Maccabee resonates through the ages. The Maccabi sports movement promotes physical strength and communal pride, much like the attributes we needed in our struggle. In 1948, Operation Maccabi liberated Jerusalem during Israel's War of Independence. Each time our name is invoked, it's a call to remember our history and the lessons it teaches us.

Interviewer: Finally, Judah, if you could impart a message to the Jewish people of today, what would it be?

Judah Maccabee: My message would be one of unity and strength. Remember where we come from, cherish the traditions that bind us, and stand firm in the face of adversity. Our strength is not just in our arms but in our spirit and our solidarity. As in the days of the Maccabees, let faith guide you, let history inspire you, and let unity empower you.

Interviewer: Judah Maccabee, thank you for sharing your insights and your time with us. Your story continues to inspire and serve as a beacon of hope and perseverance.

Judah Maccabee: It has been my honor. May the light of our story illuminate the paths of all who seek freedom and truth.

Shalom Temple Judea,

If your kids are anything like mine, as soon as your neighbors begin putting up holiday lights on November first, they will begin talking about Chanukah...incessantly. I'd love to tell you that my kids are excited about celebrating the miracle of the oil lasting for eight nights, giving tzedakah to those less fortunate than themselves, spending quality time with family and friends or even the delicious latkes my husband makes every year...but I would never lie to any of you! My kids are, in actuality, excited about the eight "crazy" nights of presents. When they were younger, I so badly wanted my three daughters to be excited about Chanukah - and by extension their Jewish identities- at this Christmas- focused time of year that I might have gone a little overboard with the nightly, theme-based presents. I have already told my daughters that this year will have to look a little different, for a few significant reasons. The first is that, with our eldest becoming Bat Mitzvah in May, and with all three girls finally eligible for Jewish sleepaway camp- we need to be a little more practical regarding our usual December spending spree. The second is that, especially with everything going on in Israel right now, I really want the girls to focus less on themselves and their own large list of "wants," and much more on the spirit of the holiday: spreading the light of Jewish joy in a darkened world. That is why this year, I'm focusing on creative ways to celebrate Chanukah, and I hope you'll find these suggestions helpful for you and your family as you prepare to celebrate this year:

- "Chopped" Chanukah: Inspired by the popular cooking tv program, Chopped, provide your family with fun ingredients to make "out of the box" latkes and/or Sufganiyot. Our family favorite is to create creative sauces for our latkes, such as garlic aioli and spicy date applesauce. This is also a great way to learn about ingredients and foods beloved in diverse Jewish communities, such as "rose jam and Malabi stuffed Sufganiyot" made popular by Persian Jews, or Sufganiyot stuffed with anise seeds and raisins, made popular by Italian Jews.
- "Adventure" Chanukah: Choose a night or day of Chanukah to spend quality time with your family choosing your own adventure. Have you been meaning to try kayaking together? When was the last time you enjoyed an art museum together, tried a new ethnic restaurant, or checked out goat yoga? Chanukah is a wonderful time to break out of your comfort zone and bond together by trying something new, together!
- "Open House" Chanukah: Now, more than ever, we need to be spreading the light of Judaism to our non-Jewish neighbors. Chanukah is an awesome time to open your home for a casual get together- invite your kid's teachers, their friends, your neighbors, and share the joy. Instead of presents, work together to prepare and decorate for the party- this effort will be such a gift for those you invite, and as a bonus will be super fun for all.
- "Crafty" Chanukah: Turn off those screens (or in my case, wrestle the iPad out of their hands) and give the fam some fun arts and crafts to focus on together. Put on some fun Chanukah music (Maccabeats, anyone?) and have a great time making friendship bracelets, matching tie-dye t-shirts, or different kinds of slime together (yes, these are outside activities!) You can also create something for your home, like a splatter paint modern art masterpiece, or paint colorful stones to place on your walkway to welcome guests.

We can't wait to hear about your creative Chanukah adventures. May this be a season of light, joy, health, and most of all- Shalom- for you, your family, for Israel, and for the world.

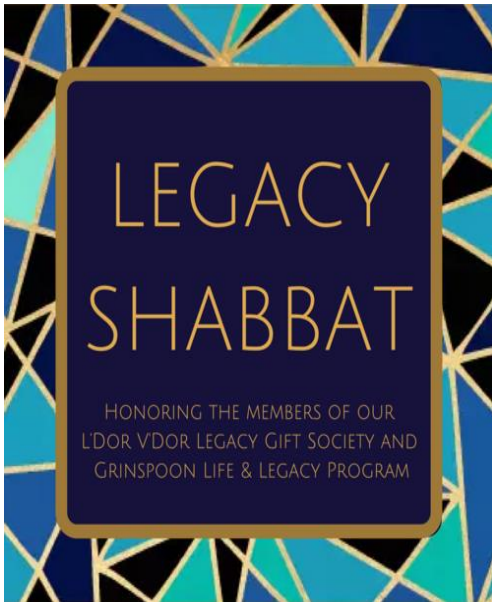

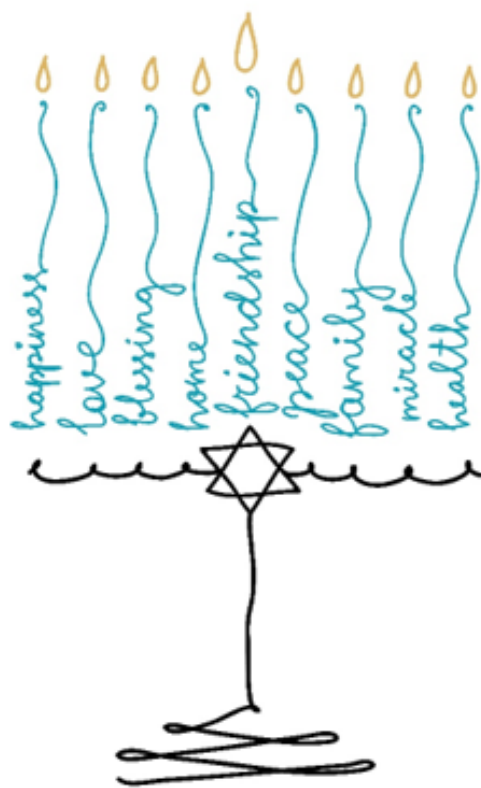

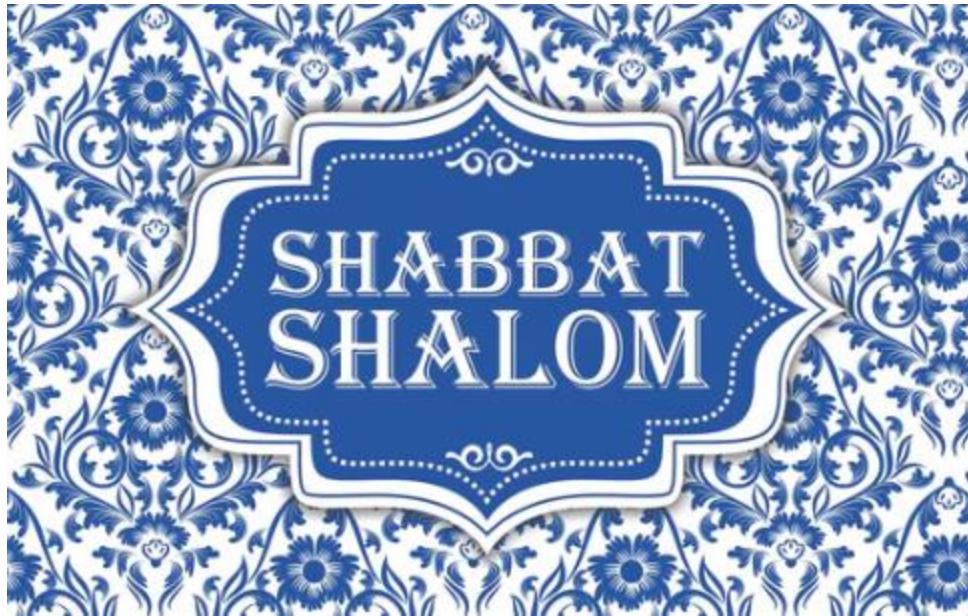

L'Chaim He - a Taste of Torah

Together Torah, Nevi'im (Prophets) and Ketuvim (Writings) comprise what is known as the Tanach. This name for the Hebrew Bible is actually made up of the first letter of each of the three sections of the Bible.

T: for Torah

N: for Nevi'im

Ch: for Ketuvim

The Torah is made up of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible. Sometimes these are referred to as the Five Books of Moses. It may also be called the Chumash, which comes from the word five.

Leviticus. In Hebrew, Vayikra. The third book of the Torah details the role of the priests and sacrifices in ancient Jewish practice. Leviticus includes many of the ethical and ritual laws that are still practiced today. **December 18**

Numbers. In Hebrew, B'midbar. This book recounts the wandering of the ancient Israelites through the desert and spells out more of God's laws. **January 22**

Deuteronomy. In Hebrew, Devarim. Moses, in his speeches to the Children of Israel offers them an ethical will, beseeching them to follow God's ways as they prepare to enter the Promised Land. **February 12**

Prophets - **March 11**

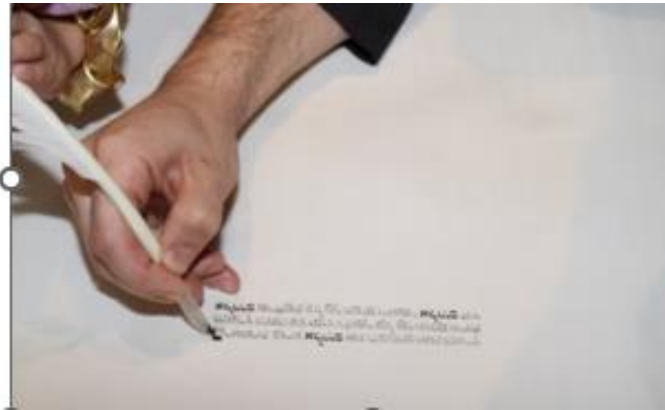

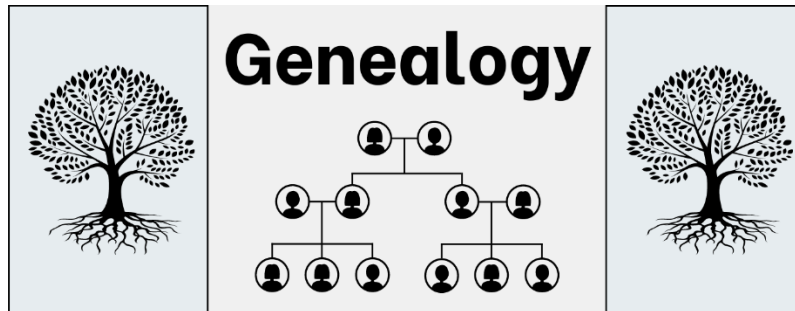

Allan Huss is a retired lawyer, but still admitted to active practice in Florida and Michigan. He is the Program Chair and Newsletter Editor for the Jewish Genealogical Society of Palm Beach County. He is also a liaison between the International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies (IAJGS) and several local societies in the United States and France. Allan has lectured at the JGS of Palm Beach County, the IAJGS, and at Rootstech in Salt Lake City – the largest genealogical conference worldwide. With over 3300 people documented in his family tree, he has documented his descent through 16 generations from Rabbi Meier of Worms, Germany (b. ca. 1450, d. 22 July 1540, Frankfurt am Mein, Germany).

Session 1 will focus on why we, as Jews, should study genealogy and learn about our ancestors. Each participant will construct a small family tree, and then will learn the tools necessary to help them fill it in. We'll talk about the myths and "bubbe meises" that get in the way of genealogical exploration, as well as some of the "incredible but true" exploits of our ancestors. What did they go through crossing to America? Why did they end up where they did? Most of the focus of this talk will be on our ancestors after they came to the United States.

Session 2 will dive into greater detail about how to find out the stories of our ancestors, including many online tools available to put "flesh on the bones" of our ancestors' lives. Do you know the town or shtetl your ancestors came from? It is key to researching records in Europe. Why did they leave a warm and comfortable place like that? And how do you find out? Much of the focus of this talk will be on our ancestors before they came to the United States.
