

According to a popular Talmudic tale, a stranger once approached Hillel and Shammai, the great sages of the first century, with a request: "Teach me the Torah while I stand on one foot." First, he brought the request to Shammai. According to the Talmud, Shammai picked up a builder's rule, smacked him alongside his head and dismissed him. So, he came to Hillel. "Teach me the Torah on one foot." Hillel taught him: "That which is hateful to you, do not do to your fellow. That is the whole Torah, all the rest is commentary. *Zil u'gemar*, now, go and learn."

This year we are so excited to welcome over 100 children to our religious school. Each year we select one theme that pervades the year, and along with the Jewish holidays, is taught to all the children – regardless of their age. This year our theme is TORAH.

Not only will our youngsters learn about our matriarchs and patriarchs, as well as some of the Torah's most significant teachings, but the children and their families will get to see a Torah come to life as we write a new Sofer Torah for the temple.

We believe the idea of Torah truly is L'Dor Va Dor – from generation to generation. For us to pass on our values, traditions, and lessons to the next generation. As such, we are calling this year's Torah project "Inscribing Their Future – Letter by Letter.

## Join me...study about our biblical Heroines!

This month, as we officially kick off our awesome Year of Torah initiative, I'm excited to begin teaching a monthly series called "Women in the Torah." I've been asking questions about the inner lives of biblical women ever since I sat in religious school as a young girl and learned about sisters Rachel and Leah... both marrying their cousin Jacob. I remember thinking to myself, "What the heck were they thinking?!" - a question that remains with me to this day. Frustratingly, the biblical narrative is very sparse on details of women's thoughts, desires, or motivations, and so today we rely on feminist midrash to help us better connect with our biblical mothers. Feminist midrash is the retellings of biblical stories to incorporate women's viewpoints into the traditional texts of Judaism. In writing these texts, authors like Anita Diamant and many others have made Judaism more inclusive of the voices and perspectives of all people who engage in its teachings. These important viewpoints and new perspectives on our matriarchs are valuable to all of us to learn from, not only women. Just as we want to spread a message of fighting antisemitism beyond the Jewish people for it to be truly effective and meaningful, so too should men engage with feminist studies to truly make our community more empathetic and inclusive. Studying women in our sacred texts will help every member of our community better understand and relate to the societal pressures that not only our matriarchs, but also women today, continue to experience every day.

I presented the first part of my presentation on "King David's Divas" to our Sisterhood in August, where we learned about Michal's significant political influence on the Davidic dynasty. During our upcoming class in October, we will focus on David's two other named "Divas," Abigail and Bathsheba, whose actions also greatly impacted the destiny of the Jewish people. Bathsheba was much more than just a woman who enjoyed public bathing, and both of their stories will inspire all people to find their unique path toward leadership and meaningful influence. Like the ultimate founding member of the "First Wives' Club," Michal, Bathsheba and Abigail use wit and strategy to speak truth to power, and to successfully impact the biblical course of events.

We can all, **regardless of gender**, learn how to improve our own communication and relationships and further connect with our Jewish tribe by studying these biblical heroes together.



### L'Chaim He - a Taste of Torah

Together Torah, Nevi'im (Prophets) and Ketuvim (Writings) comprise what is known as the Tanach. This name for the Hebrew Bible is actually made up of the first letter of each of the three sections of the Bible.

T: for Torah N: for Nevi'im Ch: for Ketuvim

The Torah is made up of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible. Sometimes these are referred to as the Five Books of Moses. It may also be called the Chumash, which comes from the word five. The five books are:

# Genesis. In Hebrew, B'reishit. This book recounts the story of creation and the lives of the patriarchs and matriarchs of the Jewish people. October 16

Exodus. In Hebrew, Sh'mot. This book details the story of slavery in Egypt, the Exodus, and the Ten Commandments. **November 27** 

Leviticus. In Hebrew, Vayikra. The third book of the Torah details the role of the priests and sacrifices in ancient Jewish practice. Leviticus includes many of the ethical and ritual laws that are still practiced today. **December 18** 

Numbers. In Hebrew, B'midbar. This book recounts the wandering of the ancient Israelites through the desert and spells out more of God's laws. **January 22** 

Deuteronomy. In Hebrew, Devarim. Moses, in his speeches to the Children of Israel offers them an ethical will, beseeching them to follow God's ways as they prepare to enter the Promised Land. **February 12**
